## **Did You Know?**

ESA reviews and reports on electrical incidents that occur. We have highlighted two of these incidents below.

# **Incident #1 - Lighting New Hire**

## Summary:

An electrical contractor received an electric shock, fell off a ladder and sustained fatal injury while he was installing a new lighting circuit in the ceiling. The worker, who was a new hire to an electrical contractor company was not a licensed electrician and was working on energized equipment at the time of the incident.

#### Causal Factors:

- Worker unauthorized to perform the work
- Working on energized equipment
- Lack of PPE
- No safety policies or procedures for performing this work

# Incident #2 - Capacitor Fan Replacement

## **Summary:**

A new hire electrician suffered severe burns due to an arc flash incident. The worker, who was unauthorized to perform work yet, was replacing cooling fans in a capacitor bank when a fan the worker was removing fell and came into contact with energized equipment.

#### **Causal Factors:**


- Arc flash analysis did not include this equipment
- Miscommunication between the supervisor and workers
- Victim was unauthorized to perform the work
- Hazard assessment failed to identify the existing hazard
- LOTO policy was not followed




