

Electrical Safety Authority - Consumer Advisory Council

ESA is seeking a number of representatives to sit on its Consumer Advisory Council (CAC).

The Electrical Safety Authority's mission is to improve electrical safety for the well-being of the people of Ontario. The CAC provides ESA with advice and guidance on the interests of the Ontario public as they relate to ESA's mandate and activities. ESA's mandate is to promote and undertake activities which enhance public electrical safety including training, inspection, authorization, investigation, registration, enforcement, audit and other regulatory and non-regulatory public electrical safety quality assurance services.

Eligibility and Competency Criteria

Representatives joining the Council must be able to provide advice and guidance on various aspects of the business that influences public and product safety as well as provide feedback on proposed program changes programs and approaches to delivering electrical safety.

This advice would typically be acquired through demonstrated competencies and experience in at least one of the following areas:

- Knowledge of standards setting

- Are not employed by ESA or connected to ESA through the employment of a family member
- Accept and meet the required preparation and meeting time commitment

Membership Terms

The term for Council members is three (3) years, with a limit of three (3) terms. Members may be eligible for reappointment at the joint discretion of the Council Chair and ESA. Reappointment will be based on member attendance, participation, and continued relevance of the subject area of the member's expertise. ESA is a delegated administrative authority, an independent, not-for-profit corporation acting on behalf of the Government of Ontario with a mandate to enhance public electrical safety in the province. ESA administers regulation in four areas: licensing of Electrical Contractors and Master Electricians, the Ontario Electrical Safety Code; electricity distribution system safety; and electrical product safety.
